What is a sabbatical?

The concept of a "sabbatical" is derived from the idea of Shabbat or "Sabbath," the seventh day as a day of rest, grounded in the Genesis creation story, in which God created the world in six days and then rested on the seventh. The biblical idea of Sabbath is a profound and still revolutionary understanding of the necessity of rest for the ongoing renewal of creation at every level, including human life. In the biblical view, a sabbatical is not a luxury, but necessity.
